Scholarship: **Schools First Federal Credit Union Scholarship**
Apply: This scholarship is awarded through the UCI on-line scholarships application. Students can apply between mid-January to mid-March through their "My Aid" account by logging in at www.ofas.uci.edu.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Undergraduate student
- Minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA
- Majoring in the fields of Math, Science, Engineering or Information and Computer Sciences
- Must declare intention to complete teaching credential program in math or science education
- Juniors or Senior student status
- Demonstrated interest in improving public education through community service, work experience, and extracurricular activities
- Submit one letter of recommendation to the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships by the application deadline, Thursday, March 24, 2016.

Scholarship: **John Ichiro Yasuda Memorial Scholarship**
Apply: This scholarship is awarded through a paper application process. To download an application, please visit our website. Students must submit the completed application to the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships located at 102 Aldrich Hall.

The John Ichiro Yasuda Memorial Scholarship provides a scholarship for the academic year to an outstanding Junior student. The scholarship is renewable for a second year during the student's senior year.

Eligibility Requirements:

- UC Irvine junior-level/third year student for the 2016-17 academic year.
- Engineering or Information and Computer Science Majors. Preference given to on-campus student workers in a computer related field.
- Minimum 2.75 cumulative GPA.
- Financial need may be considered
- Student will be required to participate in a mentorship program where he/she will be mentored (approximately 5 hours per quarter) and when the program grows to support two scholars the senior scholar (who has already had one year of mentoring) will help mentor the new junior scholar.
- The student must maintain good academic standing and a minimum 2.75 GPA to be eligible to renew the scholarship for their senior year.
- Must have a desire to help others.
- Community service experience and/or volunteer tutoring service preferred but not required.
- Students transferring to UC Irvine from a California Community College must submit official, sealed transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended.

Apply:

This scholarship is awarded through the UCI on-line scholarships application. Students can apply between mid-January to mid-March through their "My Aid" account by logging in at www.ofas.uci.edu.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Undergraduate student
- 3.5 minimum cumulative GPA
- Any academic curriculum
- Record of significant campus leadership
- Preferred, **but not required**, to be a member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternity

- U.S. citizen
- Demonstrate Financial need as determined by the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships

- Must be a U.S. Citizen or Permanent U.S. Resident
- Must be enrolled (or accepted) in an accredited college or university and planning on continuing the next year
- Must have a minimum of 30 semester or 45 quarter hours still to be completed

Eligibility Requirements:

- Be at least 17 years of age.
- Be U.S. citizens, U.S. permanent resident (holders of a Permanent Resident Card), or individuals granted deferred action status under the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals Program (DACA).
- Have received a high school diploma or the equivalent from a U.S. school.
- Have completed or expect to successfully complete a minimum of one full year of postsecondary education by June.
- Plan to enroll in full time undergraduate study at the sophomore year level or higher at an accredited two or four year college, university or vocational-technical school in the United States for the entire academic year.
- Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale (or its equivalent).
- Demonstrate financial need.
